In this course, students will work with Balianese students on the issues of women's empowerment, community development and social entrepreneurship. Students participate in an intensive practicum on activism in global civil society in an international setting and to live and work with student peers in Bali, Indonesia. Students will also work with local NGOs and social business to understand the unique challenges that women face within the Indonesian and Southeast Asian context.

Denise M. Horn is an Associate Professor of Political Science and International Relations and Associate Professor of Women's and Gender Studies at Simmons University. She has been leading students abroad for over thirteen years, with programs in South Africa, Thailand, India, Brazil, Dominican Republic, and Indonesia. 2020 will mark ten years of bringing students to Bali, Indonesia!

Dr. Horn is the author of Democratic Governance and Social Entrepreneurship: Civic Participation and the Future of Democracy (Routledge 2013) and Women, Civil Society and the Geopolitics of Democratization (Routledge 2010). Dr. Horn is an International Relations scholar, whose work explores the relationship of civil society development to democratic growth, focusing on women's transnational activism and trends in global development strategies, such as social entrepreneurship. Her current research focuses on the effects of US and Japanese family planning aid in Southeast Asia.

Dr. Horn is a 2014 Fulbright Senior Scholar, where she conducted seminars in Democratization and Human Rights at Universitas Andalas, in West Sumatra, Indonesia. In fall 2018, Dr. Horn was a Visiting Associate Professor at Osaka University, Osaka, Japan.
